THE OPENING VERSICLES (LENT): (page 260)

- L This is the day which the Lord has made;

THE PSALM: Responsively (selected verses from Psalm 106)

- P: The LORD commanded the Red Sea to dry up. He led Israel across the sea as if it were a desert.
- C: He rescued them from their enemies and redeemed them from their foes.
- P: The water returned and covered their enemies; not one of them survived.
- C: Then his people believed his promises. Then they sang his praise.
- P: Yet how quickly they forgot what he had done! They wouldn't wait for his counsel!
- C: The people made a calf at Mount Sinai; they bowed before an image made of gold.
- P: They forgot God, their Savior, who had done such great things in Egypt.
- C: So he declared he would destroy them.
- P: But Moses, his chosen one, stepped between the LORD and the people.
- C: He begged him to turn from his anger and not destroy them.
- All: Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Exodus 32:1-14

When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered themselves together to Aaron and said to him, "Up, make us gods who shall go before us. As for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." So Aaron said to them, "Take off the rings of

gold that are in the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." So all the people took off the rings of gold that were in their ears and brought them to Aaron. And he received the gold from their hand and fashioned it with a graving tool and made a golden calf. And they said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" When Aaron saw this, he built an altar before it. And Aaron made proclamation and said, "Tomorrow shall be a feast to the LORD." And they rose up early the next day and offered burnt offerings and brought peace offerings. And the people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play. And the LORD said to Moses, "Go down, for your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have corrupted themselves. They have turned aside quickly out of the way that I commanded them. They have made for themselves a golden calf and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" And the LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, and behold, it is a stiffnecked people. Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them, in order that I may make a great nation of you." But Moses implored the LORD his God and said, "O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you have brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'With evil intent did he bring them out, to kill them in the mountains and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Turn from your burning anger and relent from this disaster against your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, to whom you swore by your own self, and said to them, 'I will multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your offspring, and they shall inherit it forever." And the LORD relented from the disaster that he had spoken of bringing on his people.

THE EPISTLE READING: 1 Corinthians 10:5-8

Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness. Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day.
