Easter Worship Continues:



A Zoom Study for Youth!

The last few weeks you may have felt like you've been locked up! Isaac Newton, William Shakespeare, and Frida Kahlo all produced amazing work while isolated in a quarantine. And the apostle Paul wrote some of his epistles while being isolated in a prison cell. So what better to do than to study about the wonderful things that can happen when a lot of the world is taken out of the picture. Every Friday at 2 PM Immanuel High School youth

(even if you're not an Immanuel High School youth (even if you're not an Immanuel member you're welcome!) will be gathering virtually in the Youth Room to study the book of Philippians as well as talk about what we have been feeling and accomplishing in our time apart. Be a Part of "Feeding Seymour"

Immanuel is partnering with other churches and agencies in town to provide meals for a vulnerable population of Jackson County – the "unsheltered" (homeless) and the "sheltered to some degree" (those who occasionally stay in a hotel room provided by another). We will be cooking and distributing up to 200 meals every Sunday, beginning this Sunday, April 26, and for the next 10 weeks. We will need 3-4 volunteers to work in the kitchen of the school, cooking and packaging the meals. We will need 4 - 5 volunteers to help distribute the meals in a safe setting. And we would love to have members make "ration packs" – a gallon zip lock bag with one protein (peanut butter, cans of Vienna sausage, tuna, etc.), a fruit cup or Jell-O cup, a sleeve of saltines, a chewy granola or breakfast bar, and 2 - 3 pieces of hard candy. You may call the office and schedule times to volunteer. You may drop fully packaged "ration packs" or ingredients to make the "ration packs" to Door #5 at the church (right outside the church office). Thank you for prayerfully considering this opportunity to serve…Pastor Rodriguez
