Volunteers Needed

Immanuel is partnering with Gleaners Food Bank to provide volunteers to load donated food into vehicles on February 23 from 3:15 – 6:00 p.m. We need 10 – 12 volunteers to put boxes (approximately 30 pounds) in the trunks of people who come for the assistance. The event will take place in the parking lot of Tanger Outlet Mall and will happen as long as the temperature is above 30 degrees. This will be a “contactless” event so you would not be in close contact with any of the recipients. It is also a great opportunity to teach children the value of volunteering, and children from age 13+ are welcome to participate as long as they're with a parent or guardian. 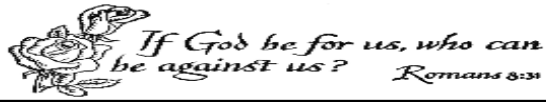
Special Voters Meeting

A special Voters meeting of Immanuel has been called for Sunday, February 14, at 12:30, following the second service. To consider a recommendation from the School Board and Trustees to add Kindergarten to Immanuel this coming fall. We have discussed this with Zion representatives, as well as a proposal for them to expand their program to include infant care.

What are some reasons for this proposal? In 2008, Zion had more than 50 students in Kindergarten, which supported 2-3 first grades. From 2009-2019, Zion Kindergarten graduated around 35 students each year. The number this year is less than 20, and the number for next year is estimated to be 16-18.

We believe that strong Kindergartens at Zion and Immanuel are both necessary. Since most parents express the desire for a continuity of care, those who choose Zion for preschool will likely choose Zion's Kindergarten. Those who choose ILCCM for childcare will likely choose Immanuel's Kindergarten. Immanuel would pay the tuition for its member families in either program. It would take 2-3 kindergarten classrooms for optimal enrollment at ILS.

All confirmed members are eligible to vote and encouraged to attend. Answers to “Frequently Asked Questions” have been prepared to address more details than space provides for here. Copies are available at the church and in the office.
