Election Day is Tuesday





Presence Candle

Why is there a single candle always lighted in both the church and the chapel? Why is one white and the other red? The candle on the stand below the round Gethsemane window and the one that stands on the altar in the chapel are called "presence candles." Many churches use them to signify that God is always present in His sanctuary, day and night, even when His people are not. These are 7-day candles, meaning they burn for an entire week before our custodian changes them on Friday of each week. It is customary to use light from the candle being replaced to start the new candle. The candle sits in a glass housing for protection. The glass in the main sanctuary was recently changed to clear because it was otherwise difficult to see in the church and online. The holder in the chapel is from the old sanctuary, which had a red glass housing. The stand on the altar that holds the Bible and the cross above the altar are also from the old church.
