Vicarage Endowment Started

Vicars have been an integral part of Immanuel for many years, helping to serve the needs of our members while also helping to train pastors for the church. Immanuel budgets about \$21,000 per year for the salary of the vicar, plus insurance, travel, and housing costs. The Immanuel Church Foundation would like to start a perpetual endowment to help offset these costs.

The long term goal is to reach a fund balance of \$500,000 or more in order to provide annual financial support to the Unified Budget that would cover most if not all of the vicar salary. The goal for 2020 is to raise \$150,000 or more of new dollars that are donated and received during 2020 with the Foundation offering a 50% match up to a maximum amount of \$75.000.

The Foundation believes that starting the Vicar Endowment is a great way to celebrate our past Vicars and embrace the future by providing funding for future Vicars. There is still time to contribute to the Vicar Endowment in 2020. The funds received in 2020 would still get the 50% match.
