
Luther's Small Catechism—A Manuel for Discipleship

Community: We Are Not Alone! Pastor Rodriguez+ Walnut Room

This study is spurred on by the events of the past year. Some people have sadly determined that they can do "church" in their homes, in their recliners, with their cup of coffee, watching on TV. This is a dangerous precedent. We will look at what the church is, where the church is, and who the church is through the lens of Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions.
