

Stained Glass Window Project Approved

The voters unanimously approved the Stained Glass Window Project last Sunday. This project would replace the 6 large bays of windows in the church on the south and north sides with beautiful and insulated stained glass.

In the center of each of the 6 large bays will be one of the windows from the 1890 church (currently in the atrium) that depict scenes in the life of Jesus, from His birth to His ascension. On either side of the original windows will be new windows that expand the story told and also bring its message into our time. Each of the large window units will have five panels in all. The old wood framing will be taken out and replaced with insulated aluminum framing with Bedford Limestone on the bottom inside and out.

We have contracted Butler/Vargo of Indianapolis for the stained glass work and Goecker Construction for the removal and placement as well as the stone work.

The total project budget is \$350,000, or \$12,000 per panel. This project is scheduled to take 18 months - completion date estimated for June, 2020, in line with the 150th anniversary celebration. Contributions for this beautification project can be made to the ILC Stained Glass Window Fund.
