

Lesson 2

Acts 12:4-17

Herod was about to bring Peter out to judge him. On that very night, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains. Sentries before the door were guarding the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood next to Peter. A light shone in the cell.

The angel struck Peter on the side and woke him. He said, "Get up quickly." And the chains fell off his hands. And the angel said to him, "Dress yourself. Put on your sandals. Wrap your cloak around you and follow me."

And Peter went out and followed him. He did not know that what was being done by the angel was real. He thought he was seeing a vision.

They had passed the first and the second guard. They came to the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them on its own. They went out and soon the angel left him.

When Peter came to himself, he said, "Now I am sure that the Lord has sent His angel. He rescued me from the hand of Herod."

Peter went to the house of Mary. Many were there praying. He knocked at the door of the gateway.



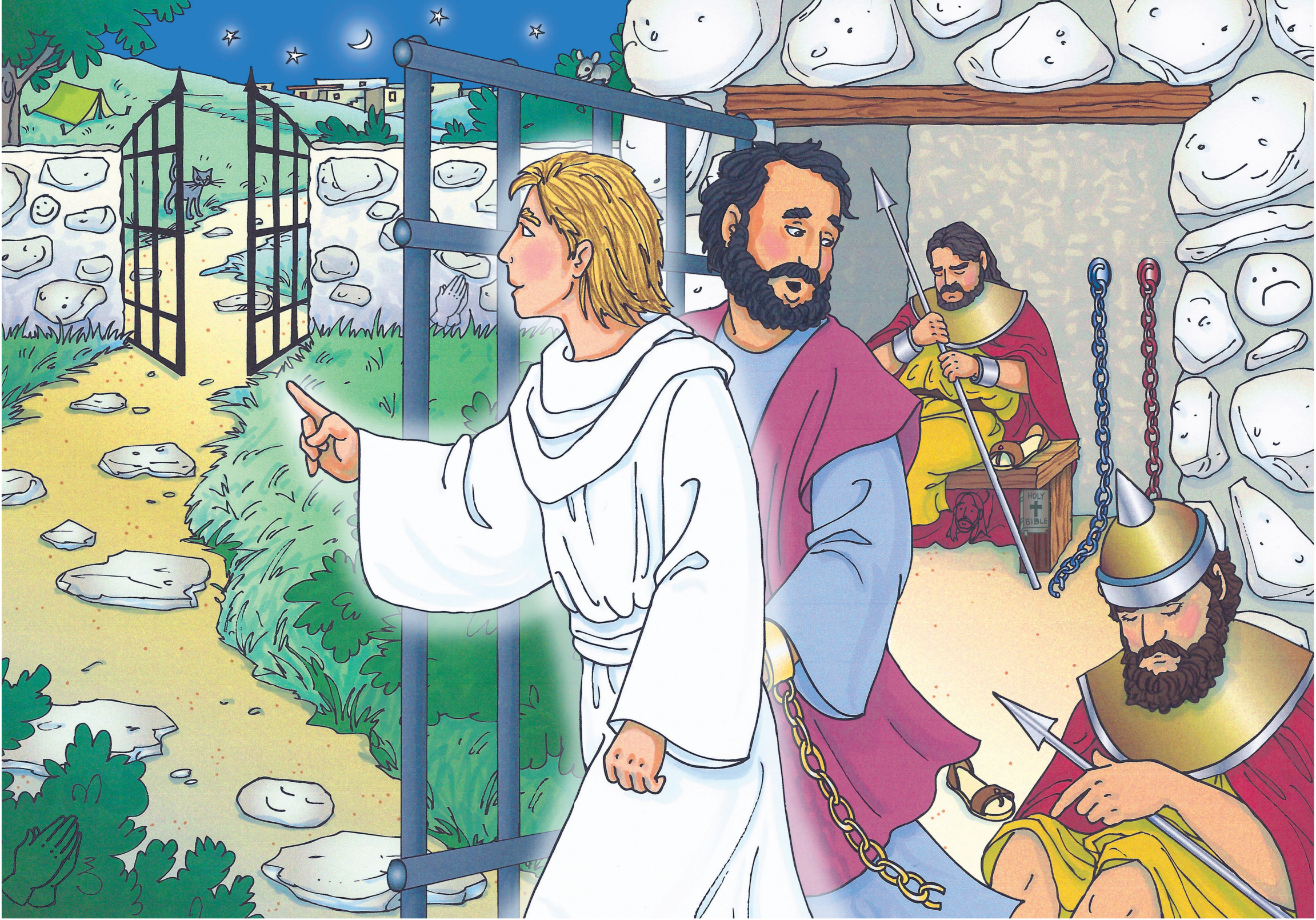

Lesson 3

God Cares for Us: Elijah and the Widow of Zarephath

1 Kings 17:8-24

King Ahab was more evil than all the kings who came before him. He worshiped a false god named Baal.

The prophet Elijah went to King Ahab. Elijah warned the king, “God says there will be no rain for years.”

Then God told Elijah, “Arise! Go to live in Zarephath. I told a widow there to feed you.”

Elijah went to the city gate. He saw a widow gathering sticks. He called to her, “Bring me a little water. I would like a drink.” As she was going for water, he also asked for bread.

She said, “I only have a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. I am gathering sticks so I can make bread. We will eat it and die.”

Elijah said, “Do not be afraid. Go and make bread. First, make me a little bread. Bring it to me. After that, make something for yourself and your son. God says, ‘The jar of flour shall not run out. The jug of oil will not be empty, until the day I send rain to the earth.’”

She did as Elijah said. They ate for many days. The jar of flour did not run out. The jug of oil did not run out.

After this, the woman’s son became ill and died. The woman said to Elijah, “What did I do wrong? Did my sin cause my son to die?”

Elijah was sad and said, “Give me your son.” He took the boy up to his own bed. Elijah prayed, “God, let this child come back to life.”

The Lord listened to Elijah’s prayer. The child’s life came into him again. Elijah brought the child to his mother. Elijah said, “See, your son lives.”

The woman said, “Now I know that you are a man of God. Now I know God’s word you speak is true.”

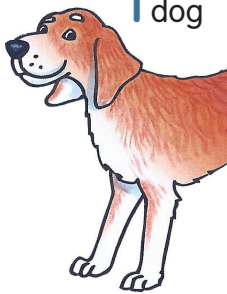

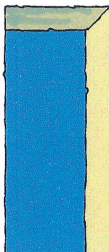

Exodus 12:1-28; 13:14

The Lord said to Moses, "I will bring one more plague upon Pharaoh and upon Egypt. Then he will let you go. Speak now to the people."

So Moses said, "Thus says the Lord: About midnight, I will go out in the midst of Egypt. And every firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die. There shall be a great cry throughout all the land of Egypt. Then you may know that the Lord makes a difference between Egypt and Israel."

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "This month shall be the first month of the year for you. Kill some lambs at twilight. Then take some of the blood and put it on the doorposts of the houses. Eat the meat that night, roasted on the fire. In this way you shall eat it: with your belt on, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in a hurry. It

is the Lord's Passover. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night. I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt. I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you."

Then Moses called all the elders of Israel. He said to them, "Go and kill the Passover lamb."

At midnight, the Lord struck down all the first-born in the land of Egypt. And there was a great cry in Egypt, for there was not a house where someone was not dead.

Then Pharaoh told Moses and Aaron, "Up! Go out from among my people. Go, serve the Lord, as you have said. Be gone, and bless me also!"

God led the people toward the Red Sea. And they camped at the edge of the wilderness. The Lord went before them by day in a pillar of cloud. And by night there was a pillar of fire to give them light.

Family Faith Talk

This week, your child learned that Jesus was born as a real human. Being human was a necessary thing for Him to be our substitute—to live perfectly and then die for our sin. The Bible tells us that Mary wrapped the human baby Jesus in swaddling cloths and placed Him in a manger.

Take a strip of cloth or baby blanket and show your child how to swaddle a baby. Talk about how swaddling helps the baby feel secure. Then remind your child that when Jesus died, He was also wrapped in cloths and placed in the tomb. But Jesus didn't stay in that tomb. He rose from the dead on Easter morning. He didn't need those cloths anymore. His victory secures our salvation.

Luke 8:22–25

The disciples still did not understand who Jesus was. They would still learn that He was the Messiah. They would learn that He was the Son of God.

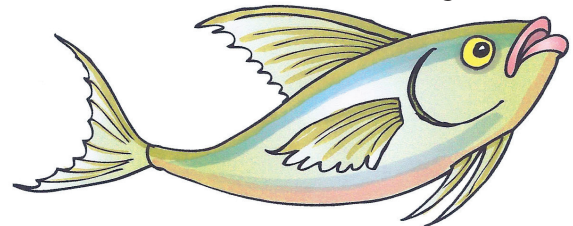


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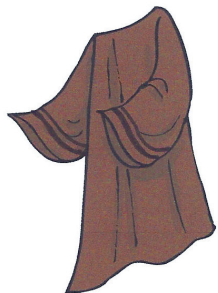

There was darkness over the whole land. Then Jesus called out with a loud voice. He said, "Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit!" And He breathed His last.

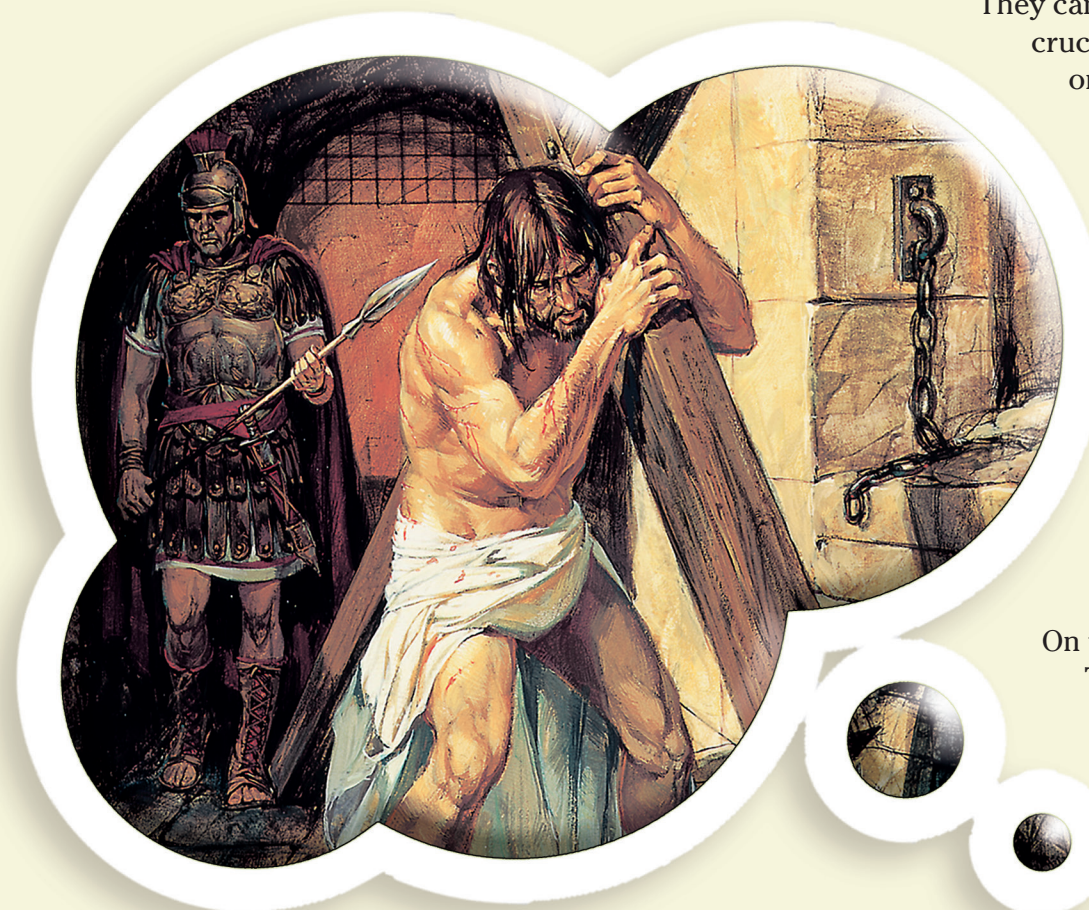

Then, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. The men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? Jesus is not here.



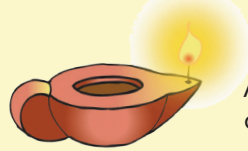
Family Faith Talk

Matthew 25:1-13

“While they were gone to buy some oil, the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went into the marriage feast with him.

“After the doors were closed, the other virgins returned and called out, ‘Lord! Lord, open the door for us!’

“‘Really, I don’t know you,’ he answered.

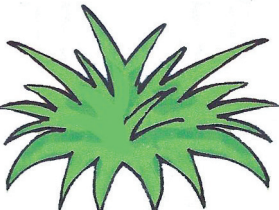

The Spirit Creates Faith: Jesus Teaches Nicodemus

John 3:1-16

There was a man named Nicodemus. He was a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night. He said to Jesus, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God. No one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Nicodemus said, "How can a man be born when he is old?"

Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.'"

Nicodemus said, "How can these things be?"

Jesus said, "Are you the teacher of Israel? You do not know these things? Truly, truly, I say to you, I have told you about things on earth.

"But you do not believe. How can you believe if I tell you about things from heaven? Remember how Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness? So must the Son of Man be lifted up. Whoever believes in Him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."

They gave a dinner for Jesus there. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those reclining with Jesus at the table.

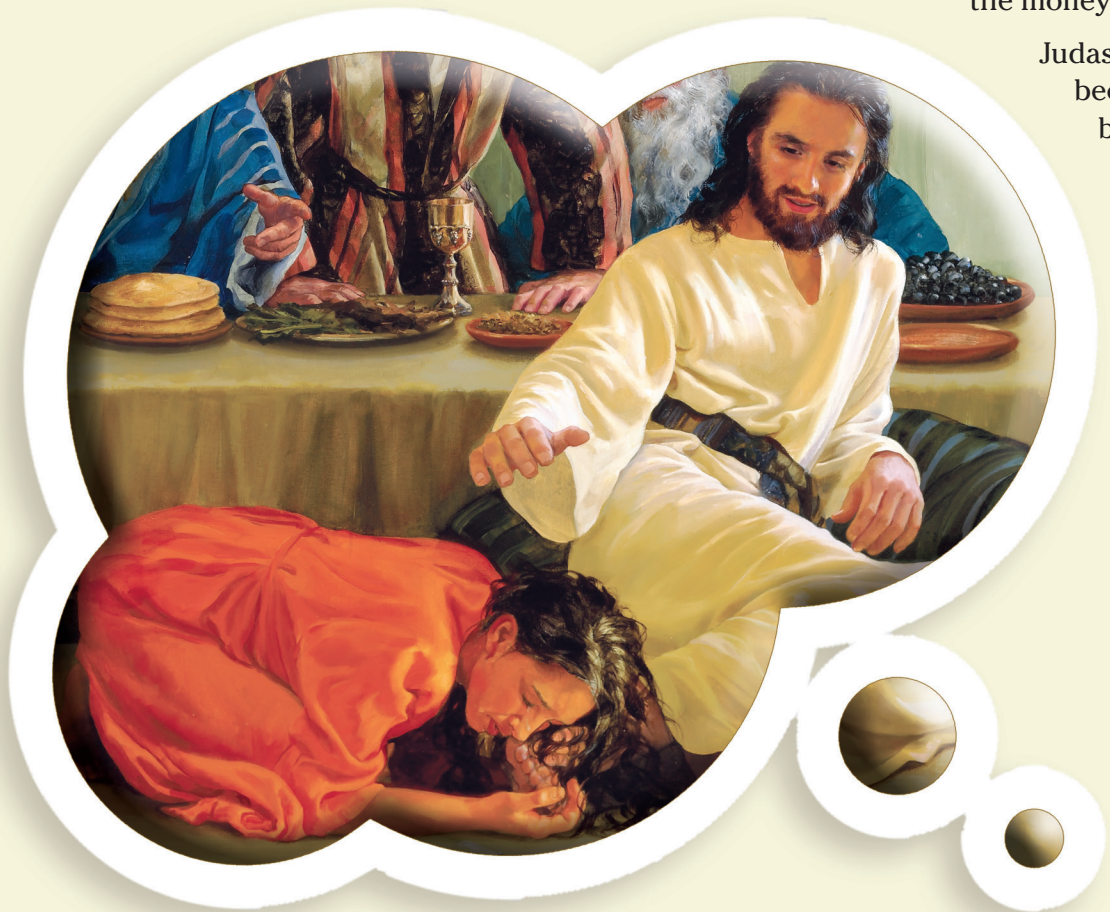
Mary took a pound of expensive ointment made from pure nard, and she anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped His feet with her hair.


Judas said this not because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief. He was in charge of the money-bag, and he used to help himself to what was put into the bag.







Family Faith Talk

Lesson 12

The Spirit Produces Good Works: A Widow's Offering

Mark 12:41-44

One of the scribes asked Jesus, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" Jesus said, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart. Love Him with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to Him, "You are right, Teacher."

Jesus said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

Later, Jesus said, "Beware of the scribes who like to walk around in long robes. They like greetings in the market-places. They like the best seats in the house of prayer. They like the places of honor at feasts. But they take away widows' houses. And they pretend to make long prayers. They will receive greater punishment."

Then Jesus sat down near the treasury. He watched the people put money into the offering box. Many rich people put in large sums.

A poor widow came. She put in two small copper coins, which make a penny.

Jesus called His disciples to Him. He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all. For they all gave out of their abundance. But she has put in everything she had. It was all she had to live on."

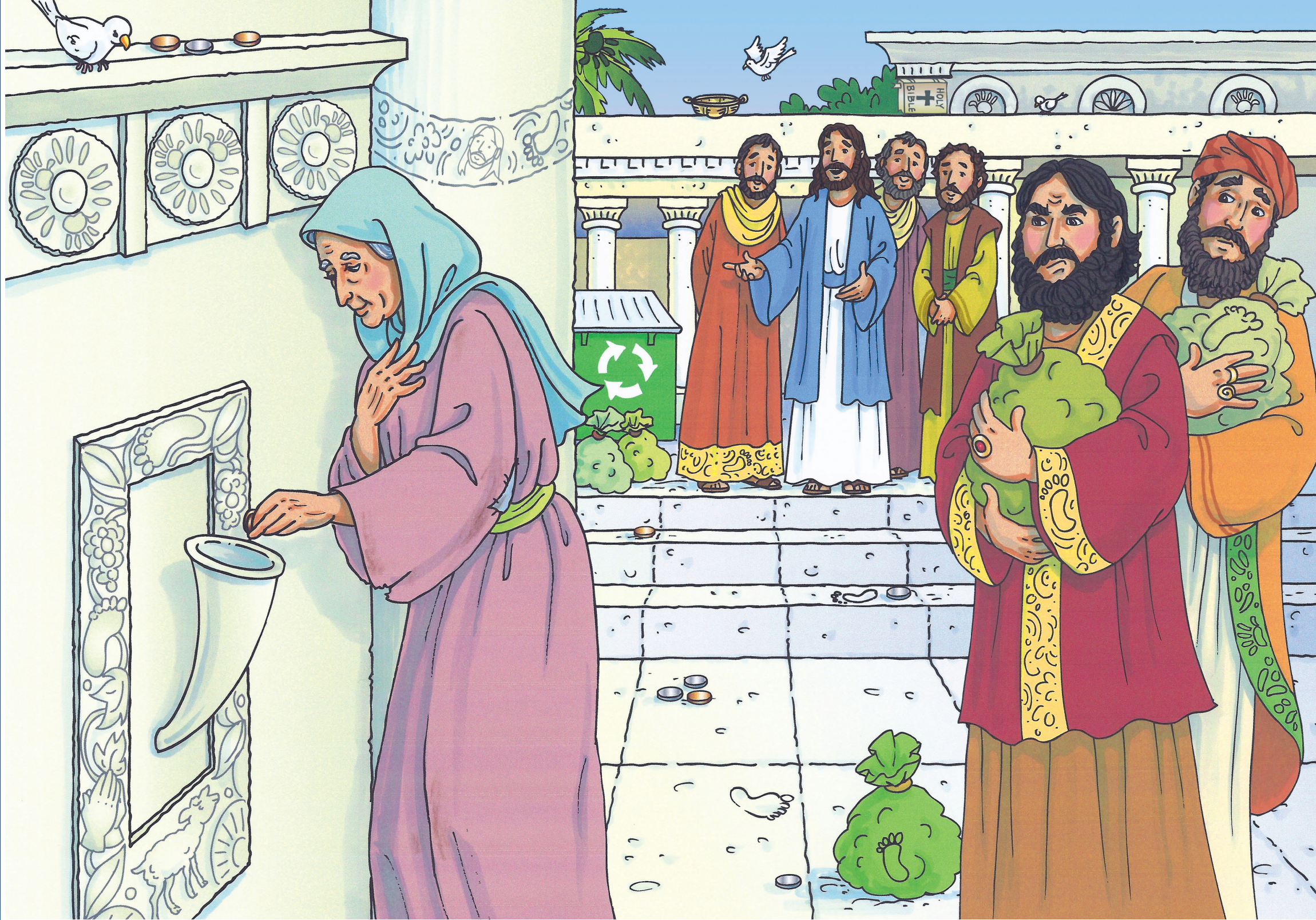

Lesson 13

The Spirit Makes the Church Grow: Philip and the Ethiopian

Acts 8:26–39

Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, “Rise and go toward the south. Take the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.” This is a desert place. And Philip rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a court official of Candace, the queen. He was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship. Now he was returning, seated in his chariot. He was reading the prophet Isaiah. And the Spirit said to Philip, “Go over and join this chariot.”

So Philip ran to him. He heard him reading Isaiah the prophet. He asked, “Do you understand what you are reading?”

And he said, “How can I, unless someone guides me?” And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this:

“Like a sheep He was led to death and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so He opens not His mouth.”

And the Ethiopian said to Philip, “About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this? About himself? About someone else?”

Then Philip opened his mouth. Beginning with this Scripture, he told him the Good News about Jesus.

And as they were going along the road, they came to some water. The Ethiopian said, “See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?” And he commanded the chariot to stop.

They both went down into the water, Philip and the Ethiopian. Philip baptized him. And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away.

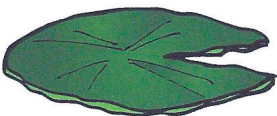
The Ethiopian saw him no more and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus. He preached the Gospel to all the towns by the sea.

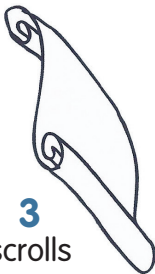

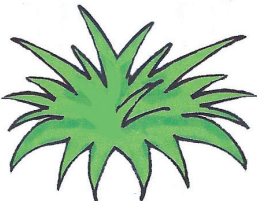
