THE PREPARATION

- C: Amen.
- L: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

WHAT WE BELIEVE ABOUT HOW GOD FORGIVES

- L: What is the Office of the Keys?
- C: The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.
- L: Where is this written?
- C: This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: "The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone His sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven'" (John 20:22-23).
- L: What do you believe according to these words?

- C: I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.
- L: Let us confess our sins to God.
- C: Merciful God, we have sinned in our thoughts, words, and actions. Not only have we done what is wrong, but we have failed to do what is right. We have neglected the means of grace, and have not loved our brothers and sisters as we ought. For the sake of Jesus Christ, forgive us and renew us. Empower us by Your Holy Spirit to live for Your glory and to serve others.
- L: God is merciful! He sent His Son into this world to be made sin for us. In His death and glorious resurrection, He provided forgiveness for us and by the power of the Holy Spirit He restores us to His family. By Christ's command, it is my privilege, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, to forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: Let us pray. Almighty God, grant that we who have celebrated the Lord's resurrection may by Your grace confess in our life and conversation that Jesus is Lord and God; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C: Amen.

- C: Prayer is speaking to God in words and thoughts.

- L: To whom should we pray?
- C: We should pray to the true God only, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, not to idols, saints, or anything God has created.
- L: What should be the content of our prayers?
- C: In our prayers we should ask for everything that tends to the glory of God and to our own and our neighbor's welfare, both spiritual and bodily blessings. We should also praise and thank God for who He is and what He has done.
- L: How should we pray?
- C: We should pray in the Name of Jesus, that is, with faith in Him as our Redeemer; with confidence, that is with firm trust that for Jesus' sake our prayers will be answered; and according to God's revealed will.

- C: God the Holy Spirit prays with and for us.

- C: God hears the prayers of all Christians and answers in His own way and at His own time.

THE FIRST READING: Acts 5:12-20 (Page 913)

Now many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high esteem. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed. But the high priest rose up, and all who were with him (that is, the party of the Sadducees), and filled with jealousy they arrested the apostles and put them in the public prison. But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out, and said, "Go and stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this Life."

L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God!

THE SECOND READING: Revelation 1:4–18 (page 1028)

John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before His throne, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. To Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood and made us a kingdom, priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of Him. Even so. Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea." Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. The hairs of his head were white like wool, as white as snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength. When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades.

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THE GOSPEL READING: John 20:19-31 (Page 906)

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld." Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." Eight days later, His disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then He said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name.

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Spring/Summer Bible Study Class Descriptions

Will the "Real" Jesus Please Stand Up? + Pastor Bloch + Fellowship Hall

Our culture is used to choices-and lots of them. Our culture allows the sinful heart to go the way of idolatry. Our culture also believes that truth varies from person to person. All of this is what allows for such a great diversity of "false christs" in North America. This class will explore twelve false christs that you may have bumped into from time to time. We will explore who the real Jesus of Scripture is and then be able to contrast the real Jesus with all of the false christs. Who Jesus has lasting ramifications in this life and the next!

Lutheran Doctrine and Practice + Pastor Blomenberg + Fellowship Hall

Lutherans are known among Christians as being concerned about correct teaching or "doctrine." It is based on our understanding that what you believe, and whether or not what you believe is true, makes a difference in how you live as well as how you understand God's work in your life and world. In this class, we will continue to explore, based on the Bible and the Augsburg Confession, teachings such as good works, free will, confession, and the church.

Broken: 7 Rules You Should Break + Vicar Werner + Fellowship Hall

"There are only two kinds of spirituality in the world. One is false, and one is true. One is the manifestation of the old evil foe who has sent many false "spiritualities" out into the world, and the other is the holy spirituality found only in faith in the one true God. One is a lie, and one is real. But which is which? Come to class with Vicar Werner on Sunday mornings at 10:15 AM in the Fellowship Hall as we examine seven false "Christian" rules or teachings that every Christian ought to break as often as possible, because they are nothing more than the traditions of men. Jonathan Fisk's book, Broken, will guide our discussion and study, and show us that, under the cross and in the pure Word of God, we will find the truth!"

What Do Lutherans Believe, and Why? + Pastor Rodriguez + Room 202

This course will look at the essential teachings of the Bible about life, God, the world, and the future. It provides the basic information needed for someone who is thinking about joining our church and can be a good review for members who have been here all their life. We will look at the Bible's perspective on evil in a world God made good; how we can speak of God's creation in view of current scientific theory; and how Scriptures written long ago are reliable for us. We'll also address how we can be certain of salvation and how our beliefs are similar to and different from other Christians. Using the Bible, a workbook, the Catechism, & discussion, we'll discover real answers for tough guestions, including the ones you want to ask. This class will prepare non-members to join the church, but there is no obligation to do so.
