Deaconess Kelly's work quickly began to bridge many of the gaps that often hinder a child's healing. Nearly all of the female residents and many of the male resident have been traumatized at the hands of a male figure. This simple reality creates immediate trust issues that can be difficult for a child to bridge, especially when dealing with a male chaplain. The Word of God helps to heal the walls of broken trust.
