The Books of Solomon

Last week we discussed the prophetic poetry concerned with the covenant. This week we will see Solomon's concern with Wisdom in his poetry.

Video/Lecture Notes:

- These three works are written in the larger context of the epic story of the Bible, especially considering Eden and the fall into sin, and they parallel Solomon's life.
- Proverbs is primarily concerned with men pursuing wisdom, showing a picture of Wisdom as how life was designed to work in creation
- Ecclesiastes was written later and provides reflections on life since the fall of mankind into sin, with all the disappointments that accompany a broken world
- Song of Songs provides a series of love poems that illustrate God's relationship with His people, through which they may find true wisdom and come again into paradise
